



Bozburun - Hisarönü - Bozburun

DAY 01

BOZBURUN

Bozburun is a lovely small town 45kms west of Marmaris. It is home to a small but modern marina and the town is famous for its shipbuilding industry.

This is where some of the world's finest wooden boats and Gulets are fabricated. Go for a walk and see how the Gulets are built at any of the many yards dotted around.

Bozburun is great for a relaxing evening. This means you will not find night life here. What you will find are amazing hotels, cafes, bars and restaurants all serving local cuisine.

We will board at 16:00 and overnight in a secluded cove.

DAY 02

BENCIK COVE

We will make our way to Söğüt. In this sparkling bay, we will have breakfast followed with swimming, snorkeling and some relaxation.

After lunch we make our way to Bencik Bay, located near the Hisarönü Gulf at the narrowest point of the Datça Peninsula. Two spheres of water is held at bay by a slim slice of land. The Persian army back in 550BC (Xerxes and the 300) built a tunnel so he could connect directly to the Gulf of Gokova to speed up his fleets attacking capabilities.

The surroundings are quiet, forested, and ideal for nature lovers. It's a good place for sunset views, campfires, stargazing, yoga, or simply relaxing in the fresh sea air.

DAY 03

AKTUR BAY

Aktur Bay is one of the hidden jewels of the Datça Peninsula, famous for its crystal-clear water, pine forests, and peaceful atmosphere. Its history is a fascinating blend of ancient civilizations, modern Turkish tourism, and environmental conservation.

Aktur occupies a unique geographical position close to where the Aegean and Mediterranean Seas meet. On calm days, locals sometimes point out subtle differences in the water's colour and currents, adding to the bay's enduring appeal.

We will overnight in this beautiful bay.



DAY 04

ORHANIYE

Today, Orhaniye is famous for the extraordinary Kizkumu (Maiden's Beach) sandbar, but its history stretches back more than 2,000 years, weaving together ancient Carian settlements, medieval fortifications, Ottoman traditions, and local legends.

Walk along Kizkum Beach or explore the ancient remains of Bybassos. Stop at Rabbit Island. The most striking feature of Rabbit Island is the remains of an ancient fortification perched on its summit.

We find a beautiful cove and overnight here.

DAY 05

SEIMIYE

In the Gulf of Hisaronu lies the village of Selimiye. One of the most prominent and distinctive natural phenomena occurs during the sunset, when the village's colour changes into a deep red.

Near Selimiye you can find ruins from the ancient city of Hydas, including remnants of three hilltop castles, old city walls, a lighthouse, and a theatre — reflecting the area's long history.

Local paths and coastal walks offer beautiful nature views and quiet moments in the countryside.



DAY 06

ADABOGAZI (AQUARIUM BAY)

Visitors know it for its astonishingly clear waters and the seabed is often visible to the naked eye. The sheltered conditions create calm, glass-like water.

Today, when a yacht drops anchor in the crystal-clear waters of Adaboğazı, it is following a maritime tradition that began long before the first maps of the Mediterranean were ever drawn.

What makes Adaboğazı special is not a single monument or ancient ruin, but its enduring role as a safe haven.

You will spend the day here and enjoy the absolute natural beauty that is on offer.





DAY 07

DISLICE ISLAND

Dişlice Island is one of those places where nature takes centre stage. It may not have grand temples or medieval castles, but its tooth-like cliffs, ancient sailing heritage, and pristine waters have made it one of the most memorable landmarks on the Turkish Blue Cruise route. Standing off its rugged shoreline, it's easy to imagine generations of sailors using the same rocky "teeth" as a landmark to guide them safely along the coast of Anatolia.
