

# Dubrovnik - Zaklopatica - Dubrovnik

## DAY 01



### DUBROVNIK

The city of Dubrovnik, once the heart of the Dubrovnik Republic, was a formidable rival to Venice in its prime. Today, it stands as one of the most significant tourist and historical destinations on the Adriatic and the Mediterranean.

The best way to immerse yourself in Dubrovnik's rich cultural and historical legacy is by exploring its streets on foot. A walk along the iconic Stradun and the city's impressive 25-meter-high, 2-kilometer-long walls reveals a treasure trove of palaces, churches, and countless other sites, each contributing to the city's enduring magnificence.

Your captain and crew will welcome you aboard from 16:00 with a welcome drink.

## DAY 02

### KOBAŠ

Uvala Kobaš is a small seaside village and bay best known for its natural beauty, relaxed atmosphere, and authentic local experiences.

From nearby Mali Ston, you can go on a tour to see how oysters are farmed and enjoy fresh oyster tastings. Visit family wineries across Pelješac for tastings and vineyard tours—this region is known for high-quality wines.

Not far from Kobaš, Ston is famous for its ancient walls (among the longest in Europe), historic salt pans, and excellent oysters. Kobaš is at its calmest and most beautiful in summer (June–September) when the sea is warm and great for swimming.



## DAY 03

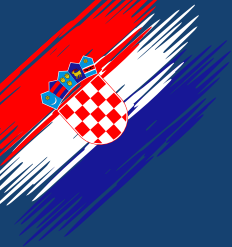
### POMENA

Pomena is a quaint port village nestled within the heart of Mljet National Park. Surrounded by pristine natural beauty and rich historical charm, Pomena offers a serene escape.

For spectacular panoramic views of the island, the national park, and the Adriatic Sea, take the hiking trail up to the Montokuc Viewpoint.

Rent a bike from shops along the Pomena harbor and cycle the shaded, 10-kilometer circular trail around Veliko Jezero and Malo Jezero (Big and Small Lakes). The water is incredibly clear, calm, and slightly warmer than the open sea.





## DAY 04



### ZATKLOPATICA

Zaklopatica is a charming cove located on the northern side of Lastovo, just 2 km from the town. Zaklopatica serves as an ideal starting point for exploring Lastovo's stunning natural surroundings, whether by land, sailing, or diving. T

here is also a rare bird species, Puffinus yelkouan, nesting on the small islet in the bay — its calls (described as similar to a child's cry) add unique natural ambience for bird-watchers.

The small-scale settlement and narrow coastal paths offer a tranquil walking experience; ideal for people who prefer low-key, slow-paced holiday vibes.



## DAY 05

### VELA LUKA

The Vela Luka region on the island of Korčula boasts a history of habitation that dates back to the Old Stone Age, around 20,000 B.C. Throughout the centuries, Illyrians, Romans, and Slavic peoples have all contributed to the area's rich cultural and historical legacy.

Vela Spila (Big Cave) is a famous prehistoric archaeological cave site above town with finds dating back thousands of years, an easy uphill walk from Vela Luka.

Visit the Vela Luka Cultural Centre, which combines local history, art, and archaeological exhibits (including pieces from Vela Spila).



## DAY 06

### KORCULA

The island of Korčula is a true gem of the Adriatic archipelago, renowned for its intricate coastline of islets and inlets, as well as its lush vegetation.

Visitors can enjoy numerous beaches for swimming or explore an underwater world teeming with fascinating flora and fauna. The city of Korčula is a historic and tourist hub celebrated as one of the best-preserved medieval towns in the Mediterranean.

Korčula is also home to the Moreška, a traditional sword dance and one of only three chivalric dances unique to the island.

The town is famously regarded as the birthplace of Marco Polo.





## DAY 07

### PROŽURA

Prožura and Prožurska Luka (the bay area just below the village) is all about beautiful coast and calm nature, it isn't a big tourist hub, but it's great for relaxing.

Visit local historic churches: Church of the Holy Trinity – a historic parish church in the heart of the village, the Church of St. Martin – dedicated to the village patron saint. Church of St. Roch – with a local feast day celebrated on August 16th.

A 17th-Century defensive tower overlooking the settlement testifies to the village's past as a refuge against pirate attacks and provides a nice historical focal point.

After all our exploring, we will set sail for Dubrovnik and over night.
