

Dubrovnik to Split

DAY 01



DUBROVNIK

The city of Dubrovnik, once the heart of the Dubrovnik Republic, was a formidable rival to Venice in its prime. Today, it stands as one of the most significant tourist and historical destinations on the Adriatic and the Mediterranean.

The best way to immerse yourself in Dubrovnik's rich cultural and historical legacy is by exploring its streets on foot. A walk along the iconic Stradun and the city's impressive 25-meter-high, 2-kilometer-long walls reveals a treasure trove of palaces, churches, and countless other sites, each contributing to the city's enduring magnificence.

Your captain and crew will welcome you aboard from 16:00 with a welcome drink.

DAY 02

POMENA

Pomena is a quaint port village nestled within the heart of Mljet National Park. Surrounded by pristine natural beauty and rich historical charm, Pomena offers a serene escape.

For spectacular panoramic views of the island, the national park, and the Adriatic Sea, take the hiking trail up to the Montokuc Viewpoint.

Rent a bike from shops along the Pomena harbor and cycle the shaded, 10-kilometer circular trail around Veliko Jezero and Malo Jezero (Big and Small Lakes). The water is incredibly clear, calm, and slightly warmer than the open sea.



DAY 03

KORČULA

The island of Korčula is a true gem of the Adriatic archipelago, renowned for its intricate coastline of islets and inlets, as well as its lush vegetation.

Visitors can enjoy numerous beaches for swimming or explore an underwater world teeming with fascinating flora and fauna. The city of Korčula is a historic and tourist hub celebrated as one of the best-preserved medieval towns in the Mediterranean.

Korčula is also home to the Moreška, a traditional sword dance and one of only three chivalric dances unique to the island.

The town is famously regarded as the birthplace of Marco Polo.





DAY 04



KOMIŽA

A charming traditional fishing town on the western coast of Vis Island known for its stunning scenery, beaches, sea caves, local culture, and laid-back island vibe.

One of the most famous natural attractions in the Adriatic, the Blue Cave on nearby Biševo Island is a surreal sea cave where sunlight refracts through an underwater opening and bathes the interior in glowing blue light. You can take a short boat trip from Komiža to see it — best around mid-day when the light is strongest. Visit the Fishermen's Museum.

Climb or bike up to Hum (587 m) for breathtaking panoramic views over Komiža, Vis town, surrounding islands and the Adriatic.



VIS

Vis rated as one of the top 5 Croatian holiday island resorts. This beautiful island has many vineyards and superb beaches, plus the surrounding sea is rich with fish, mainly the blue variety, sardines, mackerel and anchovies.

Green Cave (Zelena Špilja) – swim inside as sunlight turns the water emerald. Stiniva Cove – one of Croatia's most dramatic beaches, enclosed by towering cliffs. Issa Archaeological Site – remains one of the oldest Greek settlements in the Adriatic. Guided tours explain the island's unique 20th-century history.



DAY 06

HVAR

Hvar town, on Hvar Island, is rich in history and culture. Hvar Fortress (Španjola / Fortica) is a short hike above town. It has spectacular panoramic views over Hvar Town and the Pakleni Islands and is best visited at sunset.

In Historic Old Town you will find St. Stephen's Square, one of the largest town squares in Dalmatia, St. Stephen's Cathedral and Hvar Arsenal & Theatre – one of Europe's oldest public theatres.

Hvar produces excellent Plavac Mali red wines. Visit small family wineries or wine bars in Hvar Town and Stari Grad.





DAY 07

MILNA

Milna is a small town on the island of Brac in Croatia. Milna is known for its beautiful beaches, with numerous hidden coves reachable by foot, bike, or boat.

Wander stone streets and historic waterfront buildings to see traditional stone houses and old shipowners' homes. Visit Church of Our Lady of Annunciation, a baroque landmark.

Enjoy fresh seafood, grilled fish, octopus, and local lamb or traditional konobas right on the water.

After all our exploring, we will set sail for Split and over night.



DAY 08

SPLIT

Split is the main urban, cultural and administrative centre, for the Dalmatia region. It has exceptional road and sea links to the other main tourist resorts. Split enjoys a rich and colourful past and heritage.

More recently it has undergone much reconstruction, resulting in a cosmopolitan Mediterranean tourist destination. As it is also a major port, it is perfectly positioned as a starting/finishing destination for a Gulet charter.
