



Fethiye - Kakova - Fethiye

DAY 01

FETHIYE

Whether you love history, nature, beaches, adventure, or culture: Fethiye has something for everyone.

Visit Amyntas Rock Tombs – Ancient Lycian rock-cut tombs overlooking Fethiye, a must-see heritage site with great views. Fethiye Museum displays Lycian, Roman, and Byzantine artifacts. Paragliding from Babadağ Mountain that is a world-renowned paragliding spot with breathtaking aerial views of Ölüdeniz and the peninsula. Fethiye Fish Market is a great place to try fresh seafood and local cuisine.

Check in and your Captain will give you a small brief about the itinerary and about life on board, while you are enjoying your champagne.

DAY 02

GEMILER ISLAND

Gemiler Island, also called St. Nicholas Island, is a small island off the coast near Fethiye with fascinating ancient ruins.

Walk among remnants of five ancient churches, tombs, cisterns, and other structures from the 4th–6th centuries AD. It's believed to be a former Christian pilgrimage center. Some historians think the island was the original burial site of St. Nicholas, the 4th-century saint who inspired the legend of Santa Claus.

Trails across the island lead to elevated spots with panoramic views of the bay and coastline, perfect for photos and appreciating the landscape. Snorkeling here lets you see submerged ancient structures.

DAY 03

KAS

An early start for Yesilköy, for breakfast and time to swim in this quiet bay surrounded by olive groves.

Then it is off to Kas, a small harbor town with a charming bohemian atmosphere. Stroll the pretty harbour lined with traditional gulet boats, cafés, and shops — great for sunset views and relaxed evenings. See the Antiphellos Amphitheatre, a historic theatre facing the sea dating to around 200–300 BC. Spot Lycian rock tombs and ancient sites scattered around the town and hills.



DAY 04

SEDİR ISLAND

A short cruise to Kekova. The most iconic attraction in the region is the Sunken City, an ancient Lycian ruins (walls, foundations, staircases) partly submerged after earthquakes in the 2nd century AD.

You can view them from boats or kayaks but swimming directly over the protected ruins is not permitted. Climb up to the hilltop castle, Simena Castle, for beautiful panoramic views of the sea and surrounding ruins. Lunch is at Tersane Bay, where you will see the ruins of a Byzantine church and a Roman dockyard on the beach.

As you sail on to Gökkaya for the night, the underwater ruins of ancient Gökkaya are visible.

DAY 05

GÖKKAYA

Climb up to the castle (Kale) for a spectacular view of the ancient city. Out in the bay, overlooked by a theatre carved into the rock, a single Lycian sarcophagus sits on its pedestal in the water.

The calm, clear waters are perfect for swimming, snorkeling, and cooling off. The night is spent in the wide bay surrounded by green hills, at nearby Üçagiz, "three mouths" (referring to three channels out to sea), a charming fishing harbour.



DAY 06

KALKAN

After breakfast, a short cruise to the sheltered bay at Bayindir Limani for a swim.

The rest of the day is spent in Kalkan, a picturesque harbour town set on the hillside. Here you can explore the ruins of Patara Ancient City, including a restored Roman theatre and monumental gate, right next to Patara Beach. W

ander narrow cobbled streets lined with boutiques, art galleries, cafés, and local shops. The architecture mixes historic Greek and Ottoman influence with bougainvillea-draped buildings.

Take an optional trip to nearby archaeological sites of Myra or Demre for the St-Nicholas Church or the ruins at Xanthos and Letoon.





DAY 07

TERSANE BAY

After an early start to Tersane Bay, a natural bay edged with pine-clad hills, you will spend the day here, swimming and relaxing. You can see partly submerged ruins of an ancient Lycian shipyard along the shoreline.

Your last night on board is spent in Yassica Bay.

DAY 08

FETHIYE

After enjoying your final breakfast on board, it's time to bid farewell to your crew. We hope you've had an unforgettable experience and look forward to welcoming you aboard one of our Gulets again in the future.
